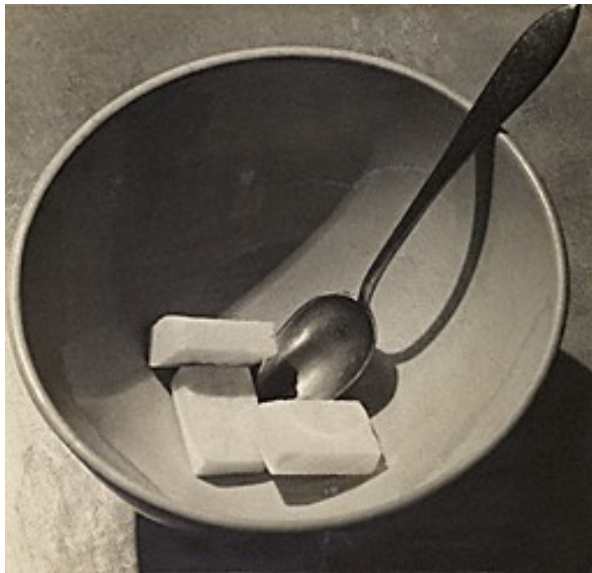

Still Life Photography - Genre based on Still Life in Art

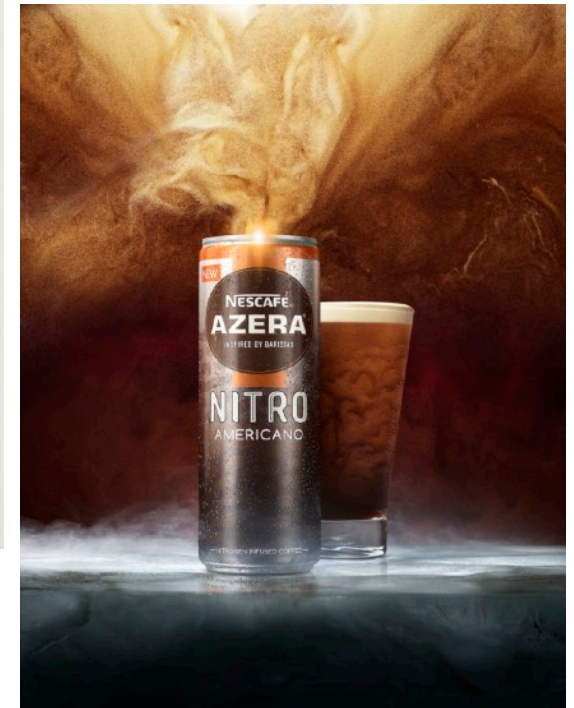

Still Life Photography as Art

- **It requires creative control - specially for composition and lighting**
- Collection of objects such as fruits, glassware, vases and flowers or whatever nowadays.
- Contemporary Still Life recalls past styles but the range has expanded to include objects in motion
- Often used for archiving and cataloguing and advertising

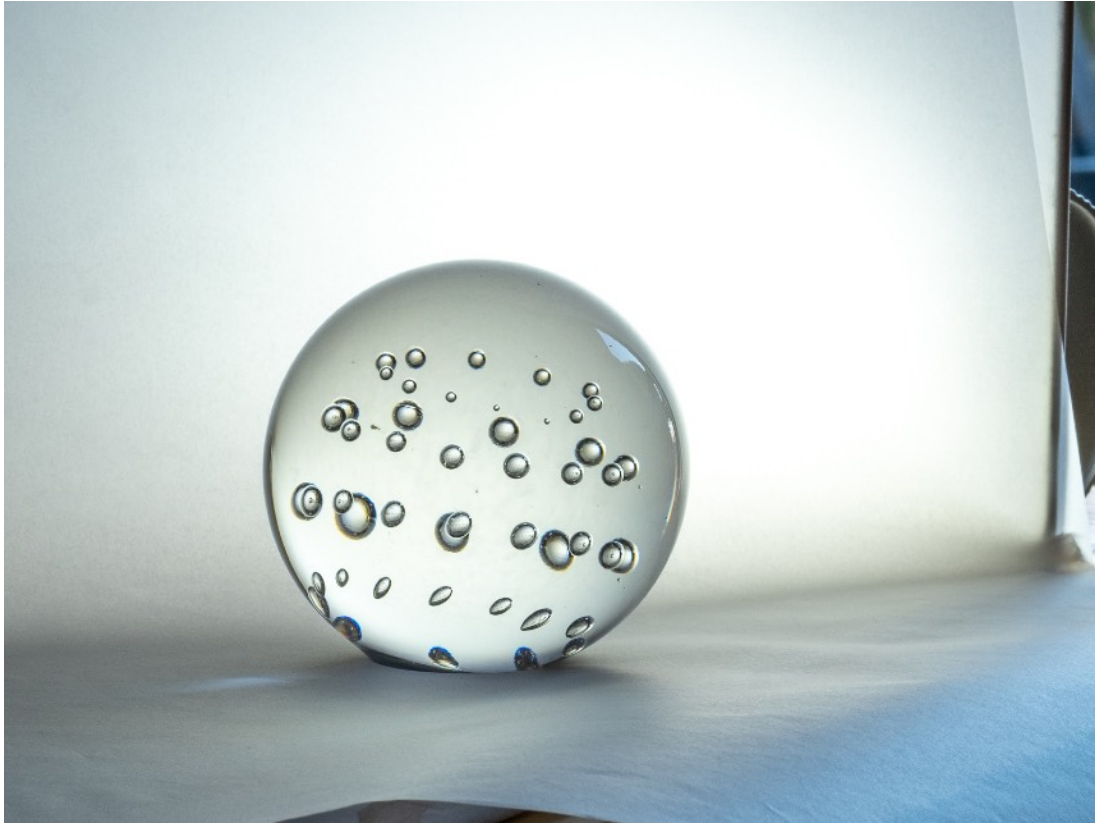


Still Life as per the Old Masters



Old fashion looking glassware set. Fruit, particularly grapes as they reflect light. Arrangement to suit the eye. A flower to balance the kiwi. Natural light from a window – should have been from the left but not in my kitchen! Another lights source from the left is a day lamp. Vignette to age the picture.
Fuji XT10, f8, ¼ sec, Iso 200

Drowning



Glass paperweight and a figure of Bathsheba (Batzeba) (Nordic mystic symbol of Beauty and Love by Mats Jonasson) – both on white background and backlit

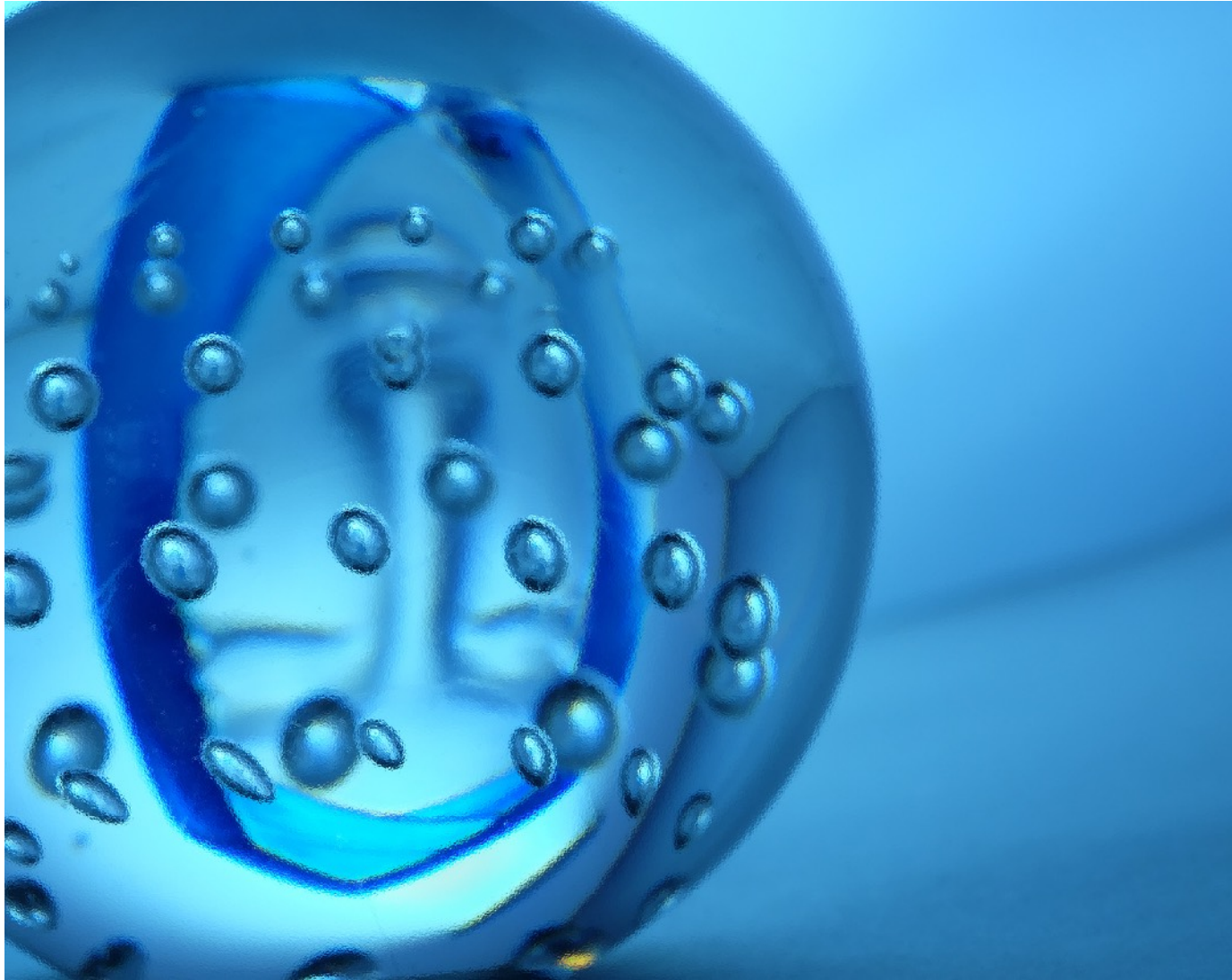




Stand Bathsheba behind the ball (you can see its tip) The ball inverts the image. Focus on Bathsheba through the ball. Ensure no unwanted images in the ball!

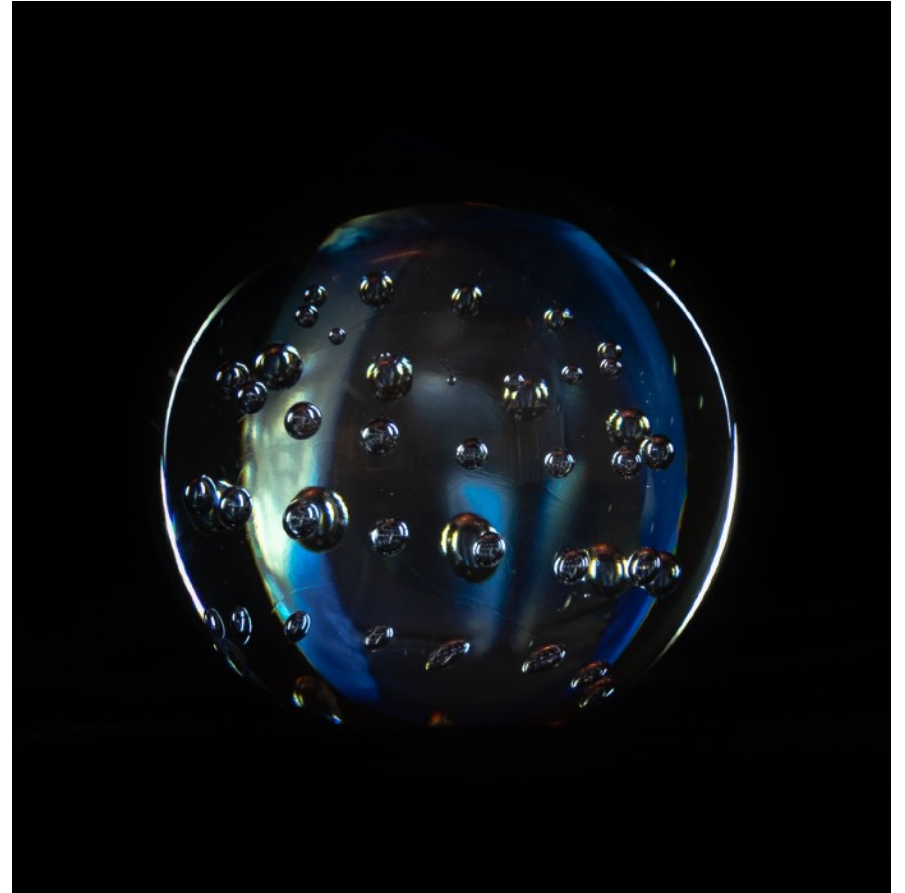
Post_processing: flip horizontally, crop and play with WB to get blue colouration

Dark Field –good for glassware



Lighting:
Black background and sides,
except for bright light from behind

Magic (Rubic's) Cube



Magic Cube - Set up

Props – Rubic's Cube

Coloured cards.

Box, black cards for surface,
Glass for reflection

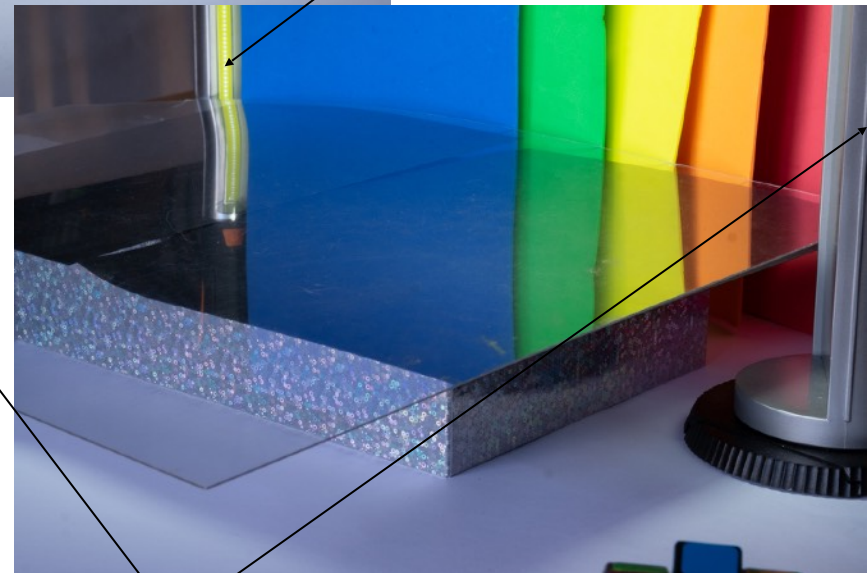
Lighting – natural light from the front

Daylight lamp directly onto the cube

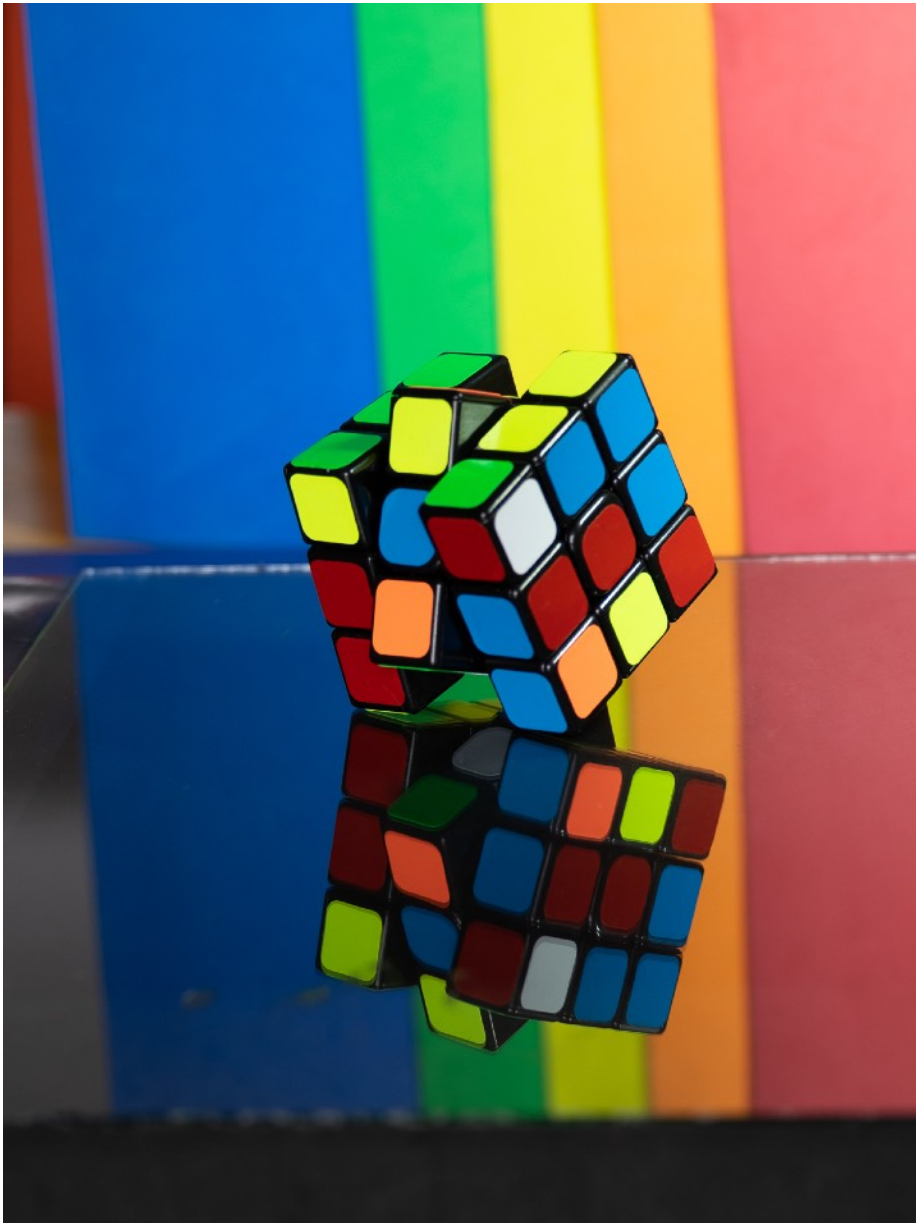
Bright light to lit the background cards



LED light



Daylight lamp from
Permajet



Fuji XT1, f4.5, 1/10 sec,
ISO200, no flash
Tripod, remote (so I do not
block the natural light) etc....

Post –process:

Lightroom Classic and
Photoshop

In Photoshop I used clone and
healing brush to remove the
edge of the glass and

Select/ invert selection to blur
the background more using
Gaussian Blur,

Magic Cube



Swing with Time – *Flash ghosting*



Dark background, object must be illuminated with sufficient light, f 8; 0.7 sec, first curtain, triggered flash (on camera dinky flash optically triggered off - camera flash – MegaBlitz). Post process - converted to B&W in PaintShop Pro, and cleaned.



Lumix FZ330, Second curtain on camera flash - Youngnuo YN560 IV; f5.6, 1/2 sec, ISO 100.

Post process – Lr, B&W, luminosity adjustment to turn the background uniformly black
