Photo One




This is the very first picture ever taken in 1826/27 by Joseph Nicephore Niepce out of his window in Burgundy entitled View From the Window at Le Gras by a process called Heliography. Exposure time was more than 6 hours.

Photo Two



I took a view from my house window over the back wall. It was difficult to reduce the quality of the picture from the digital original but the effects applied were B/W channel mixer, levels, dust and scratches blended to screen applied twice, vignette effect with circular gradient, old paper effect twice and black and white levels altered. It would have been easier to use an old camera and film!

Photo Three




This is a picture by Daguerre in 1838 which was exposed for 7 minutes and caught someone having his boots cleaned. Other people were present by as they were moving they were blurred and did not show in the final picture. The boot cleaner is also blurred. The picture is known as Boulevard du Temple.

Cambridge in a three second exposure and luckily caught one person looking at their phone. You can see some ghosting of other passer-bys in the photo. I found some difficulty in trying to get a scene with no cars which was busy but not too busy. I tried a N/D filter but it was too much and had trouble trying to get my camera to do what I wanted.
